Resurrection Eggs

Can use 18 eggs or 12

Directions:

- 1. Hide eggs, then have your children find them, but they have to wait to open them until all the eggs are found.
- 2. Once all eggs have been found, open the eggs together to go over the Easter story. Have your children's bibles ready!
- 3. As you read the Easter story (I toggle between the Jesus Storybook Bible by Sally Lloyd-Jones and the Gospel Storybook Bible published by B+H Publishing), have your children open the resurrection egg that corresponds with what part of the Easter story you have just read. See below for how to organize your eggs now!

Organizing your eggs:

- Use 7 different colors of plastic eggs to recognize the order that the eggs will be opened (or simply label them 1-18 or 1-12 with a sharpie marker!)
- Color 1 Palm Sunday symbols (small plastic palm leaves, small plastic donkey).
- Color 2 Things that happened on Thursday night before Good Friday (Passover meal and Garden of Gethsemane)
- Color 3 Things related to the crucifixion.
- Color 4 Things related to the sealed tomb (a rock/stone).
- Color 5 This egg will be empty to represent the empty tomb/resurrection! If you're only using 12 eggs, this would be the last one. To teach about the events that happened after the resurrection, add the following colors:
- Color 6 Things related to the verses/parts of the Easter story below.
- Color 7 The Ascension and Jesus' promise to return again one day.

Below is how I personally organized my eggs for reference to the images above. Organize them in whatever way makes most sense to you! ©

Egg Organization:

- Egg 1 Palm Leaves/Donkey (triumphal entry)
- Egg 2 Small piece of towel, small piece of soap bar cut (Jesus washing the disciples' feet)
- Egg 3 Wine/communion plastic cup/small cracker/wafer (Last Supper/Passover)
- Egg 4 Small plastic rooster (Rooster crowed 3x after Peter denies Jesus 3 times)
- Egg 5 Plastic hands (Praying hands representing Jesus praying in the garden of Gethsemane)
- *Other option to replace one of the eggs 2-5 3 dimes (Judas paid 30 pieces of silver for betraying Jesus)
- Egg 6 Small Leather Shoe String Cut (Jesus is whipped)
- Egg 7 Small piece of sponge cut (Jesus given vinegar on a sponge to drink)
- Egg 8 Small piece of purple cloth/material (Jesus mocked)
- Egg 9 Dice/plastic straws cut up into smaller pieces/toothpicks (Soldiers cast lots for Jesus' clothing)
- Egg 10 Nails/small wooden cross (Jesus crucified)
- Egg 11 Black cloth, large enough piece that when you open the egg, the dark piece of material almost explodes/erupts out of the egg (Darkness in the middle of the day after Jesus died) *Other option to replace one
- Egg 12 Stone/rock (Burial/Sealed Tomb)
- Egg 13 Leave empty (Empty Tomb/Resurrection!)
- Egg 14 Small map of road to Emmaus Luke 24:13-35)
- Egg 15 Small plastic sheep (Jesus reinstates Peter: "Feed my sheep" John 21:15-19
- Egg 16 Small plastic fish (Jesus feeds the disciples) –John 21:4-14 – We also love to read "The Friend Who Forgives" picture book from the Tales that Tell the Truth Series when we talk about this egg!
- Egg 17 Dried seeds or something to represent garden "Grow the kingdom of God" (The Great Commission) Mark 16:14-17, Matthew 28:16-20. Can also use to teach the Fruits of the Spirit Galatians 5:16-26
- Egg 18 Cotton ball (Jesus' ascension) Luke 24:50-23
